A Message From the ROPS School Board:

At the school board meeting on August 19, we welcomed our new member Kyle Rika, appointed following the resignation of Vasana Vanpraseuth from the board. We are really excited about the valuable insights and unique perspective Kyle will bring to our team.

Our curriculum focus for this meeting was Mathematics and Statistics. The Government recently announced plans to introduce structural mathematics earlier than planned. While the board agrees that our school is well positioned to implement these changes, we recognise the challenges this rollout presents for our staff. We would like to acknowledge their extra effort in making this transition.

We also examined how the school supports our Māori and Pasifika students and spent time looking into the results of the health consultation survey. Our next board meeting is 23 September. We welcome whānau to attend our board meetings - these are an opportunity to understand the inner workings of our kura in more depth and stay informed on the current developments at ROPs.

Eco Warrior Initiative: Taumanu Reserve Beach Audit



In Term 2 the Kauri Year 5 Eco Warriors braved a cool breeze and completed a Litter Intelligence Audit at Taumanu Reserve, Onehunga Basin, along with Onehunga Primary students. ROPS has been monitoring this beach for five years now and has been contributing to the data being gathered to help identify patterns, changes and needs of

our beautiful Mānuka-o-Hotunui. The students marked out a rectangle $20m \times 100m$ and walked in a slow line, collecting the litter in this area; it is the same place each time the survey is done. They then audited the litter by categorizing and counting . You can access this website and read the data they have collected and easily make



comparisons from past surveys of the same area. Many beaches around Aotearoa are monitored in this way and all the information can be accessed from this website related to your favorite beach spot! Thank you to these parents who helped with transportation and supervision on this chilly day, Sanjay Kumar, Julius Pamintuan, Matthew Ah Mu, Anesha Pillay, and Kitaga Sonsupap.

A Note from the Police Regarding Dropping off and Picking Up

If you choose to stop or park illegally you could get fined.

Stopped/parked	Fine
On broken yellow lines	\$60
Double parked	\$60
Within 6 metres of an intersection OR pedestrian crossing	\$60
Closer than 6 metres to a bus stop or on a marked bus stop	\$40
Parked in area reserved for disabled persons	\$150

When children arrive at or leave school each day, how you park and drive can protect them or put them in danger.

Plan ahead - sometimes a meeting point further down the road might be a safer option to avoid congestion around the area.

Often drop off and pick up zones can be crowded before and after school, so allow plenty of time for school drop offs so you are not rushed and give the road your full attention.

When choosing to park near a school make sure to park safely and legally. Where and how you park matters – tamariki can't be seen if we park illegally.


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Olympathon
