It's all go in the ROPS environment at the moment! We are learning about the spaces we are kaitiaki of in the school, clearing, replanting and in many cases harvesting. The Ropū Taiao groups are setting wasp traps to protect the fruit, caterpillars, their eggs and butterflies from these pests with great success. The butterfly house has released four butterflies in the past two weeks, and we have quite a few chrysalises coming on. If you want to protect your eggs and caterpillars from wasps bring them to us for excellent care! We are harvesting an abundance of pears,


